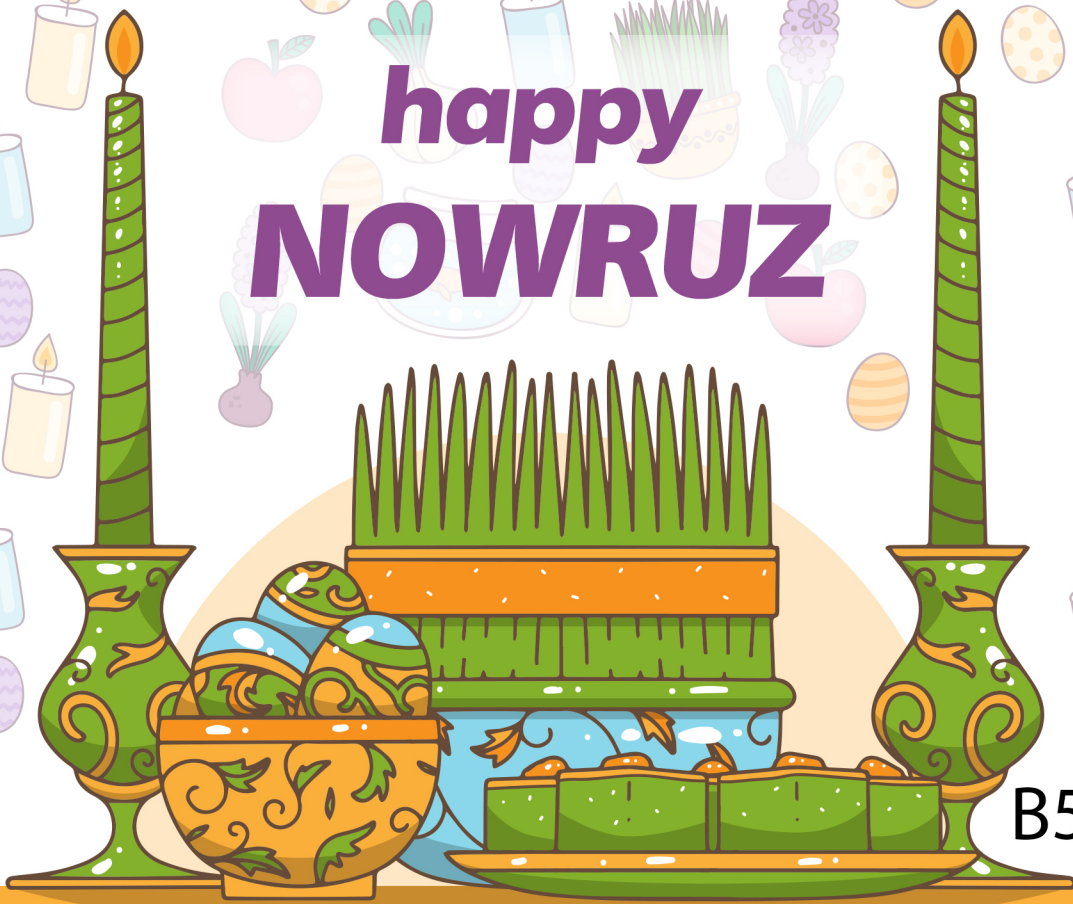

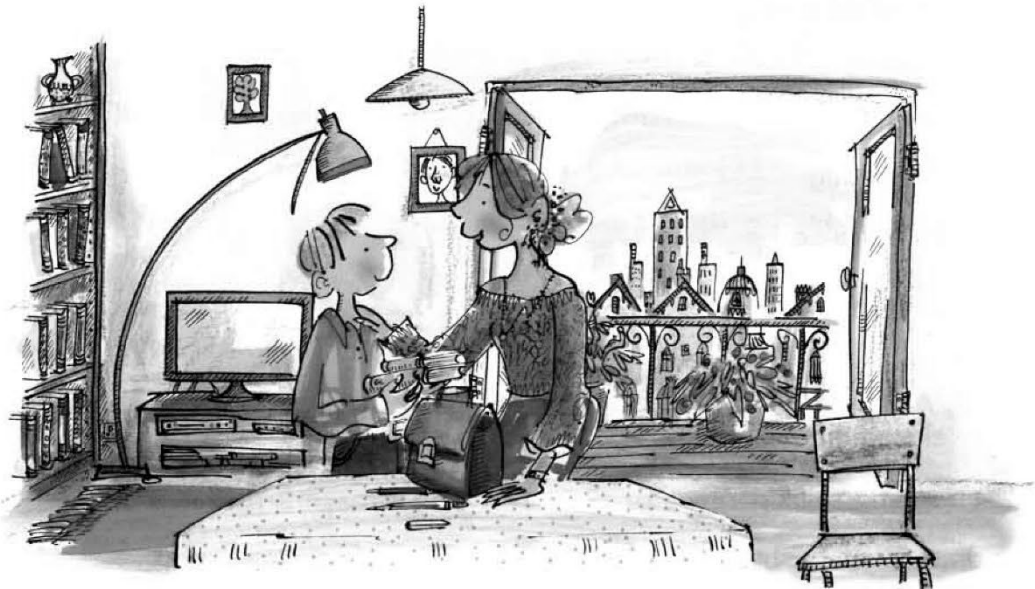

'And because of the big black and white bird!' Robert smiled.






